#### Mount Rogers Trip June 21-27

**Where:** Southwestern corner of Virginia. Judy's barn is located in Elk Creek, Virginia, which is about 25 miles south of Wytheville (located at the junction of I-77 and I-81).

**Logistics:** It is about 350 miles from Jasper to Elk Creek. From Jasper, the easiest way is to go I-75 north (I get on in Cleveland, Tennessee) to I-40 through Knoxville to I-81. Depending on where you stay, directions can be provided from there. YOU DO NOT WANT TO TAKE HWY 58 FROM I-81 around Bristol. Roads are not suitable for horse trailers. Also, some of you may be going from the Dawsonville-Cumming area and may choose to go I-85 to I-77 to Galax (Hwy 58) and over from there.

**The riding:** The riding is varied (some difficult, some easy - none of it "scary") and will require a 10-minute to 1-hour pull from Elk Creek. You can check out the trails online that we will be riding. They are listed below:

- New River Trail at Fries, Virginia, and Shot Tower: flat, easy riding on old railroad bed along the New River. Requires many bridge/trestle crossings and bicycles (not too many on weekdays).
- Virginia Highlands Trail (from Hussey Mountain Campground) and at Mount Rogers, Fox Creek: this trail is over 100-miles long and runs along a ridge of mountains through the Jefferson National Forest. Trails are usually in very good condition and are moderate trails through the mountains.
- Grayson Highlands State Park: High mountain meadow with vistas, wild ponies and hikers with backpacks (so get your horses used to them!) Some rocky trails. Steep roads getting up to the park (climbing over 2000 ft).
- Iron Mountain Trail: Crosses the Virginia Highlands Trail at both Hussey Mountain and Fox Creek.

#### Places to stay:

- Judy has 10 acres of grass, but no fencing. You are welcome to make small electric corrals for your horses. (Note that it would not be a good idea for everyone to leave the premises with horses in electrical pens incase one gets out). There are a couple of RV hook ups (water/power) if you have a LQ horse trailer. There is a kitchen and bathroom in the barn.
- There is a large barn about 35 minutes away (by car you can ride there from Hussey Mountain) called Iron Mountain Horse Camp. I know Sheila who runs the place, so if it is decided that this is the best place, I can call and see what kind of accommodations there are for the humans.
- I have found two farmhouses (one Judy, Ellen and Jodie stayed in) and one that has a paddock and run-in shelter. Both have multiple bedrooms and bathrooms.
- There are other cabins and a barn with eight stalls that we are working on as well.

#### **Action required:**

• E-mail Rich Vigue at richvigue@ellijay.com no later than March 1<sup>st</sup> and let him know what day and time you plan to arrive and your people/horse lodging requirements. Rich and Judy will then calculate the total requirements and get back to you with available options.

This year's kickoff meeting was held in two parts – Cartersville's Booth Museum in the afternoon and a dinner meeting at Crust in Jasper.




